This term we are looking at the Ten Commandments. Last week we looked at the life of Moses and how he ended up being the leader of God's people, the Israelites. God showed Moses the Ten Commandments, which help us lead lives that love God and love other people. We are going to look at what they are today.

Memory Verse

Intro into the Ten Commandments:

- What is your favourite game? What are some of the rules of the game?
- Would that game work if there were no rules? What would go wrong?
- What might be frustrating about that game if you tried to play it with no rules or if you made up rules as you went?
 - Without clear rules a game isn't fair and people could even get hurt.
 - Why do we need rules/guidelines for life?

These are rules from God because He loves us.

What are the 10 Commandments in simple terms?

- 1. Put God first
- 2. No fake gods
- 3. Respect God's name
- 4. Keep God's day of rest
- 5. Honour your parents
 - 6. Do not murder
- 7. Stay committed to your marriage
 - 8. Do not steal
 - 9. Do not lie
 - 10. Do not be jealous
